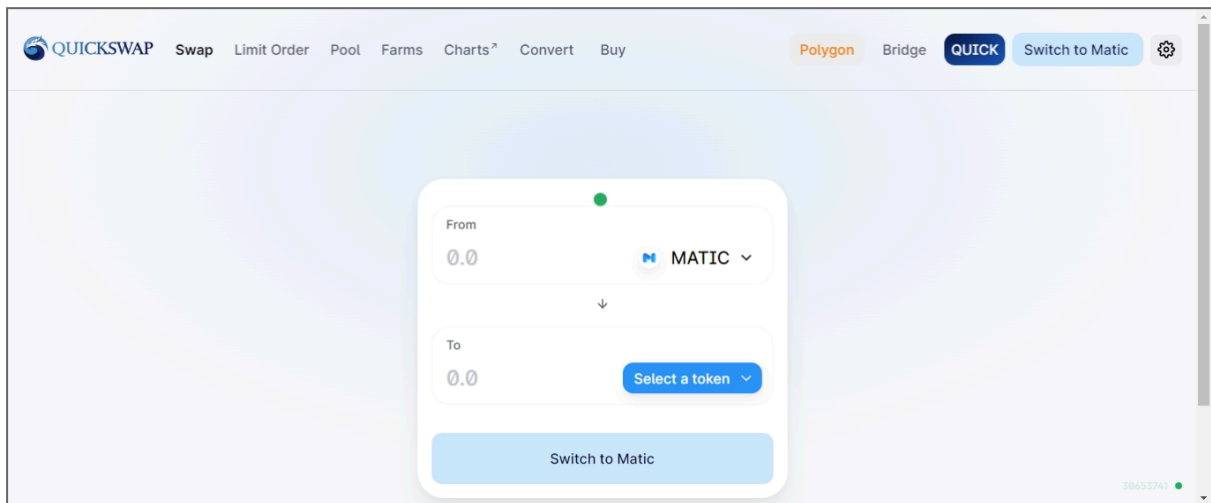

# Content Accessibility Project

The [QuickSwap DEX website](#) is somewhat inaccessible for new users getting into DeFi. Anyone visiting QuickSwap can be forgiven for being somewhat bewildered by the terms and how the website functions. Unlike a centralized exchange, decentralized exchanges do not require KYC/AML registration for use. Thus, any new user will be immediately perplexed as to where the login button might be. In general, the website assumes that users will understand the terms by looking them up elsewhere. This lack of definitions can be very frustrating.



## Complete Lack of Information

As noted above, there is a complete lack of information about what many terms mean. Nonetheless, there are no pages within the website that explain the differences between LIP mining, Dragon Mining, or Dragon's Syrup. The pool data displayed under each pool is even more frustrating, since many would-be liquidity providers do not understand how to effectively compare liquidity pools. The home page (shown above) reveals extensive room for improvement.

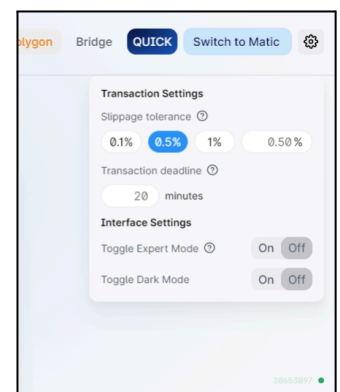
## No Login / Registration

While many DeFi users realize that decentralized exchanges do not register users, not everyone does. It would be helpful if there was a label in the top upper right-hand corner simply stating "No Registration Required." Strangely enough, I believe some crypto users may actually welcome registration since it begets the need for a password - which seemingly provides a sense of security for many crypto users.

## Technical Jargon

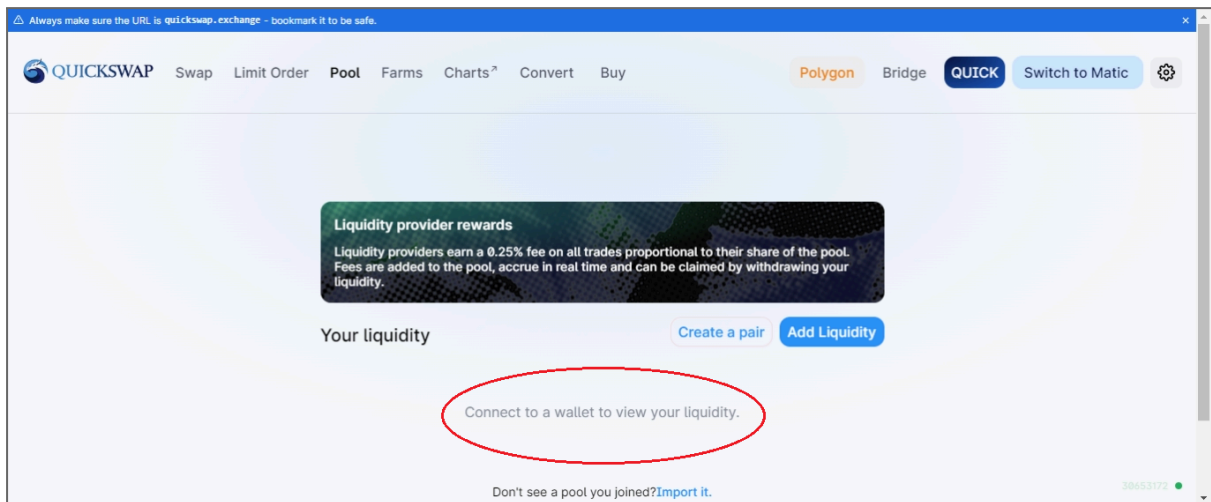
Aside from unknown page labels like Dragon's Lair, the site uses some technical jargon as well. For instance, the setting icon in the top right hand corner displays a drop-down javascript-enabled tab that lets the user select slippage tolerance (the pricing difference between the price at the confirmation time and the actual price of the transaction users are willing to accept when swapping). Most users- even expert users - would be hard-pressed to explain this term.

It would be nice if a mouse-over enabled pop-up simply gave a one-sentence explanation of the phrase. A similar issue related to the term "Bridge" on the navigation bar (needed when completing a transaction requires a bridge between two different blockchains).



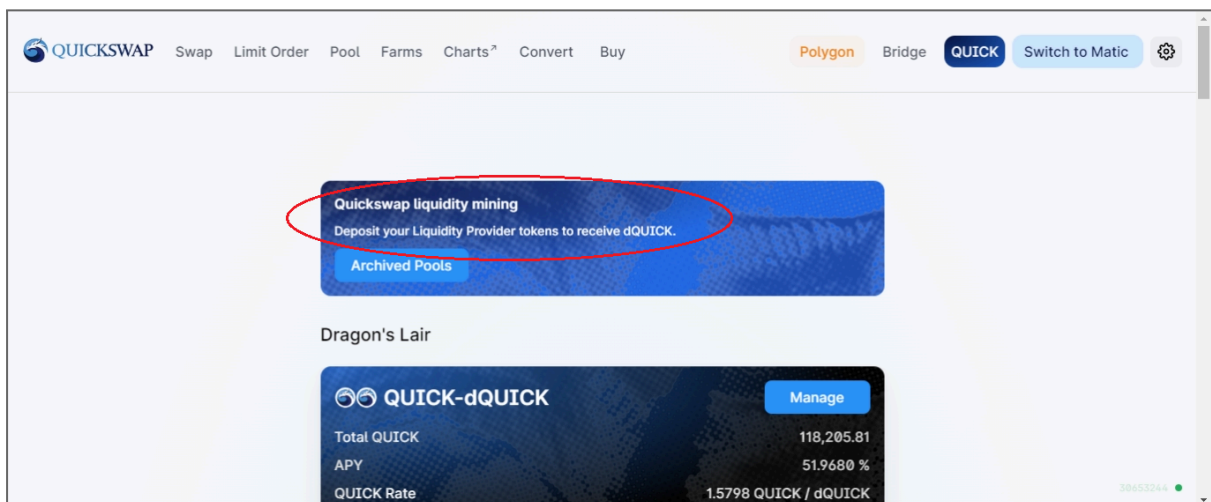
## Secondary Site / Extension Required

Although the homepage seems somewhat intuitive, new users may not understand that they need to connect to an online wallet first if they seek to swap tokens or become a token liquidity provider. Without understanding this step first, the entire website can appear somewhat baffling to the new user. Fortunately, some (but not all) pages note the need to do so halfway down the page..



## Missing Incentives

If even new users look up the terms, they're still bereft of a reason to participate. They may understand that providing token liquidity in the form of staking will provide them rewards. But there is no explanation of how to use this reward (dQUICK) and what value it has (although the Dragon's Lair page references it). Without such an understanding, potential users will remain mystified as to why they should become a liquidity provider. In the end, a simple FAQ page could go a long way in fixing many of the problems listed here.

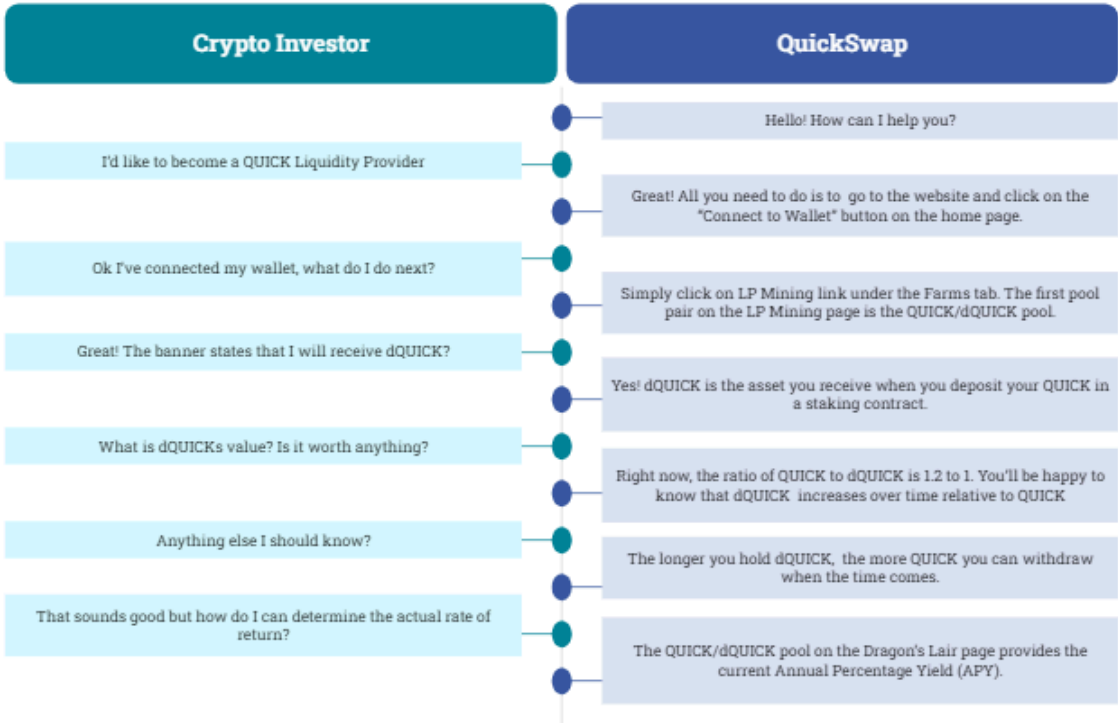

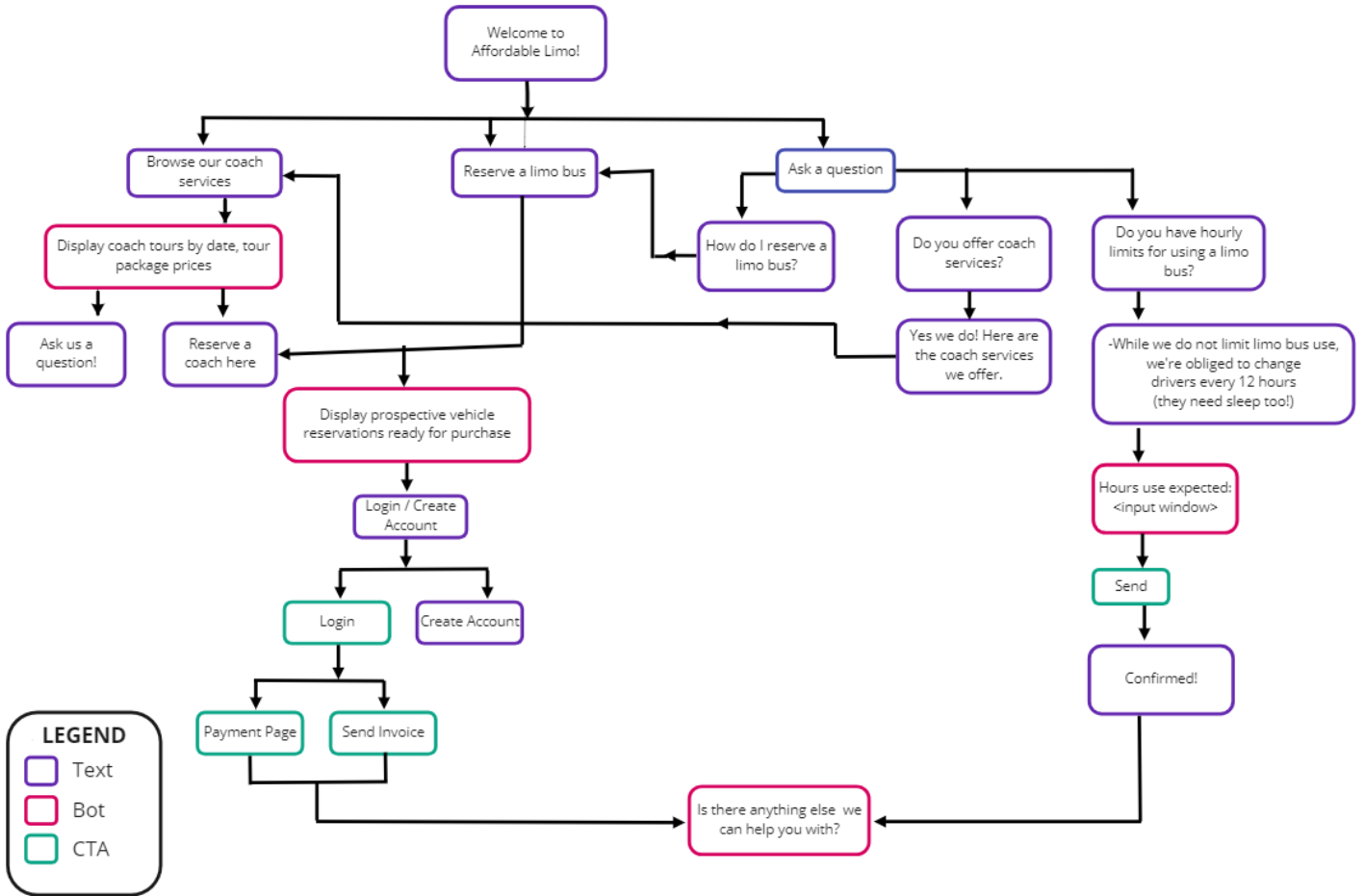

## Challenge 1: Liquidity Provider Risk Warning

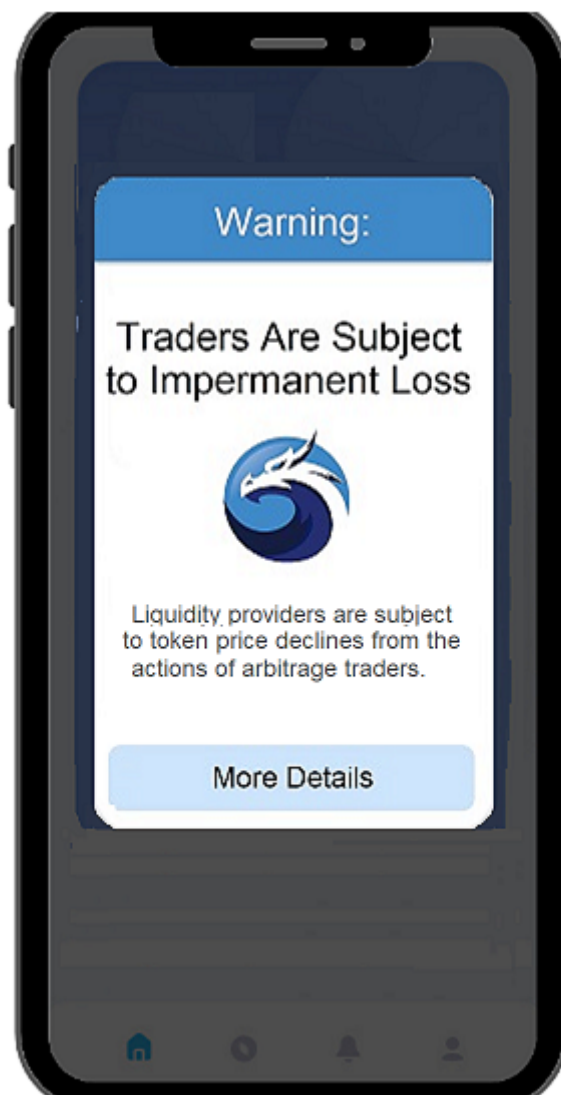

**Challenge:** Write a message for an automated market maker app warning traders about impermanent loss.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: Warning: Traders Are Subject to Impermanent Loss

**Body:** 100 Characters max: Liquidity providers are subject to token price declines from the actions of arbitrage traders.

**Button:** 15 characters max: More Details



## Challenge 2: Withdrawal Function Temporarily Suspended

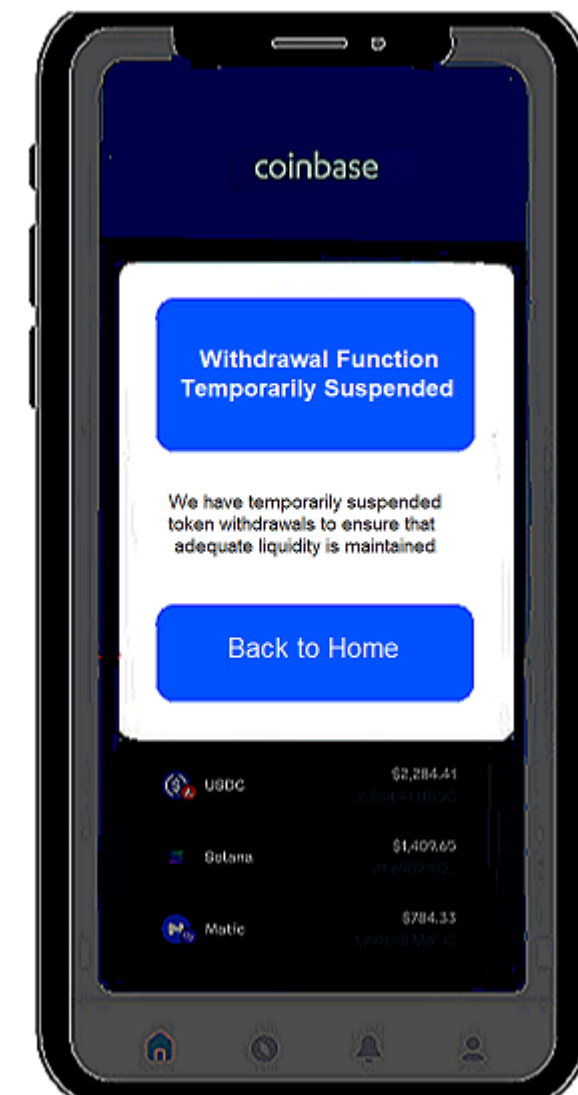
**Scenario:** A centralized exchange app is temporarily suspending the withdrawal function for a particular token because of liquidity issues.

**Challenge:** Write a message for a centralized exchange app notifying users that their withdrawal function has been temporarily suspended..

**Body:** 100 Characters max: We have temporarily suspended token withdrawals to ensure adequate liquidity is maintained.

### Challenge 3: Wallet Token Swap Failure

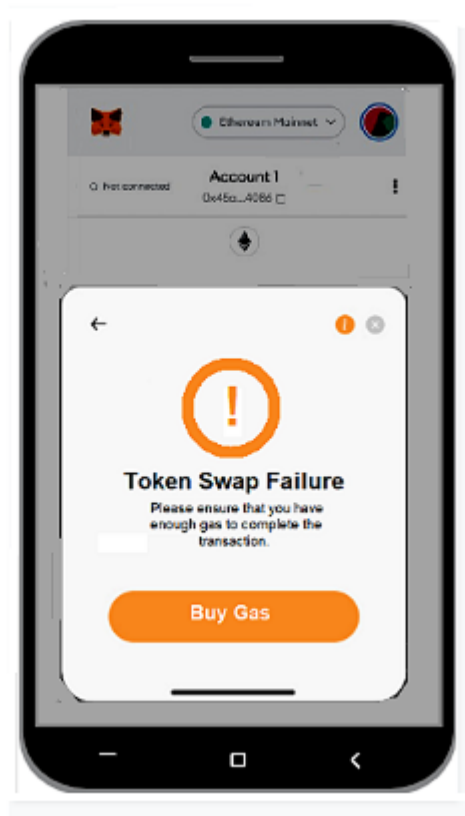
**Scenario:** A crypto trader seeking to swap their ETH for USDT within a MetaMask wallet is unable to do so because they lack the requisite Ethereum gas.

**Challenge:** Write a message for an online wallet app that a token swap transaction has failed.

**Body:** 100 Characters max: Please ensure that you have enough gas to complete the transaction.

**Button:** 15 characters max: Buy Gas



#### Challenge 4: Centralized Exchange Leverage Warning

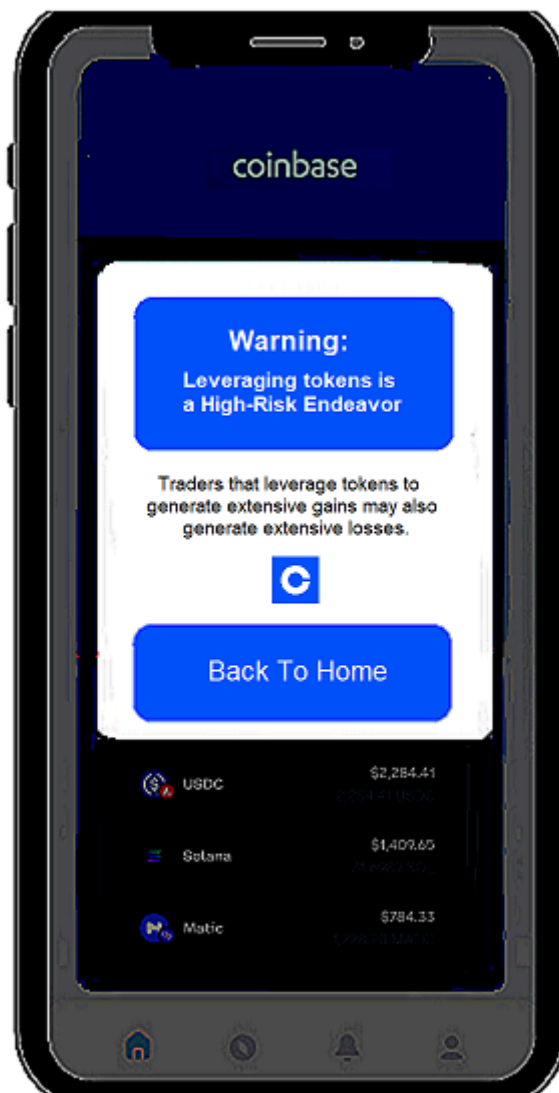
**Scenario:** Crypto traders who leverage their tokens on a centralized exchange can either generate extensive losses or extensive rewards.

**Challenge:** Write a message for a centralized exchange app warning traders that leveraging tokens for the sake of a trade is a high-risk endeavor.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: Warning: Leveraging Tokens Is a High Risk Endeavor

**Body:** 100 Characters max: Traders that leverage tokens to generative extensive gains may also generate extensive losses..

**Button:** 15 characters max: Back to Home



### Challenge 5: Token Transaction Delay

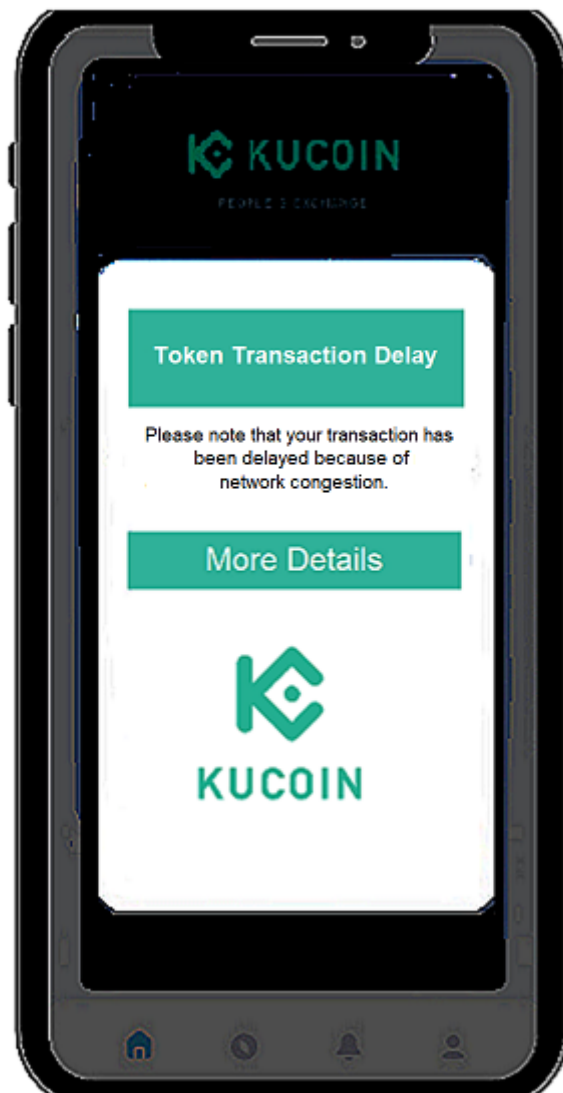
**Scenario:** Crypto traders on a particular exchange are noticing that their transactions are experiencing an inordinate delay.

**Challenge:** Write a message from the centralized exchange app warning users that token transactions may be delayed.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: Token Transaction Delay

## Challenge 6: Confirm Your Exchange Account

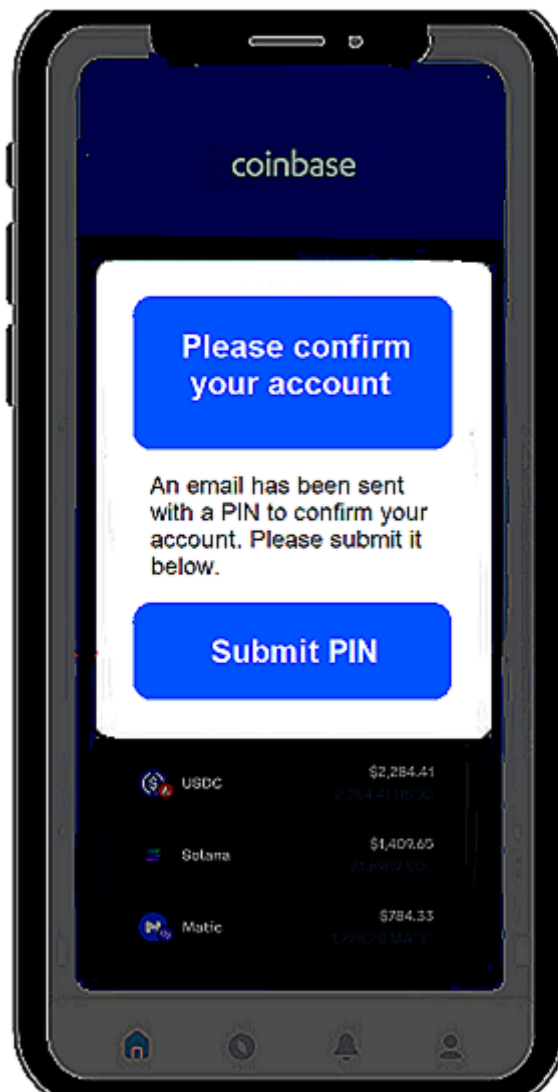
**Scenario:** A crypto trader has successfully registered to use a centralized exchange. Before they can use the account however, they must confirm their contact information.

**Button:** 15 characters max: Submit PIN



## Challenge 7: Exchange Registration Failure

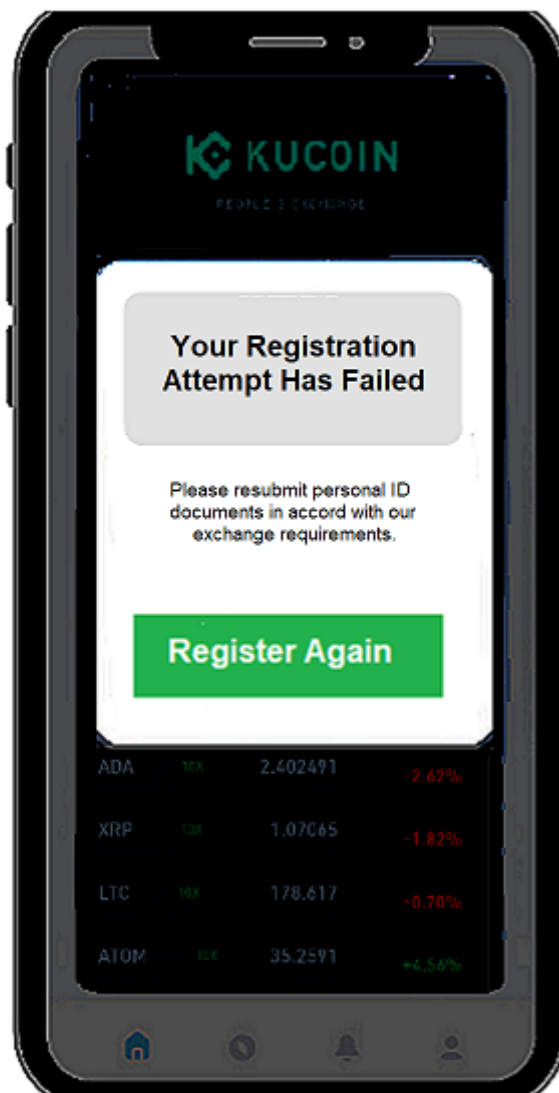
**Scenario:** A crypto trader wishing to register on a centralized exchange has not provided adequate identification to satisfy KYC/AML requirements.

**Challenge:** Write a message for a centralized exchange app that notifies users that their exchange registration has failed because of identification requirements.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: Your Registration Has Failed

**Body:** 100 Characters max: Please resubmit personal ID documents in accord with our exchange requirements.

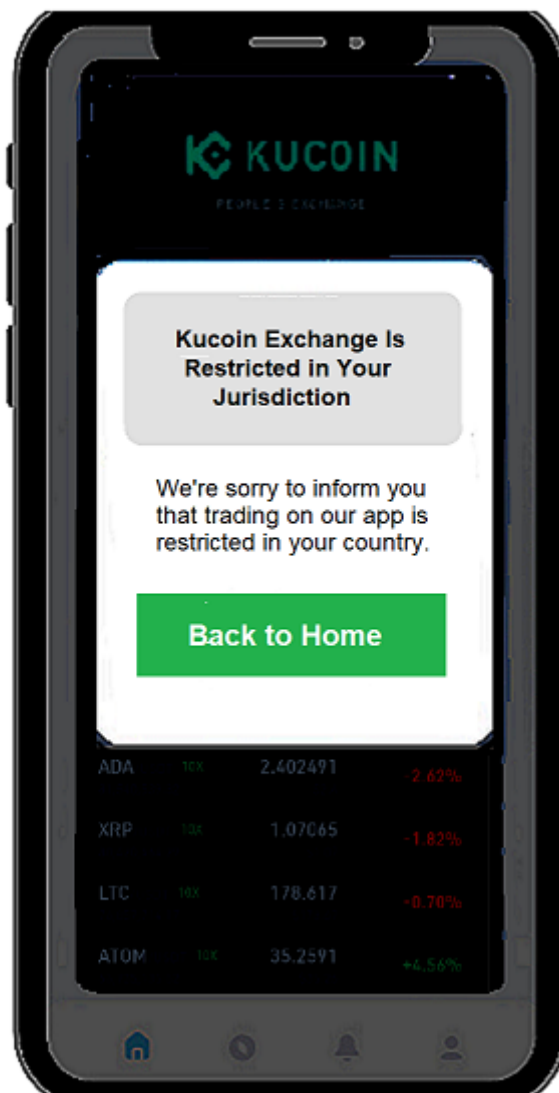
**Button:** 15 characters max: Register Again





## Challenge 8: Centralized Exchange Country Restriction Warning

- Scenario:** A crypto trader wishing to use a foreign crypto exchange is restricted from doing so because of SEC regulations.
- Challenge:** Write a message for a centralized exchange app warning users that their home country has restricted use of the exchange.
- Headline:** 40 Characters max: Our Exchange is Restricted in Your Jurisdiction
- Body:** 100 Characters max: We're sorry to inform you that trading on our app is restricted in your country.
- Button:** 15 characters max: Back to Home



## Challenge 9: Wallet DAT File Upload Failed

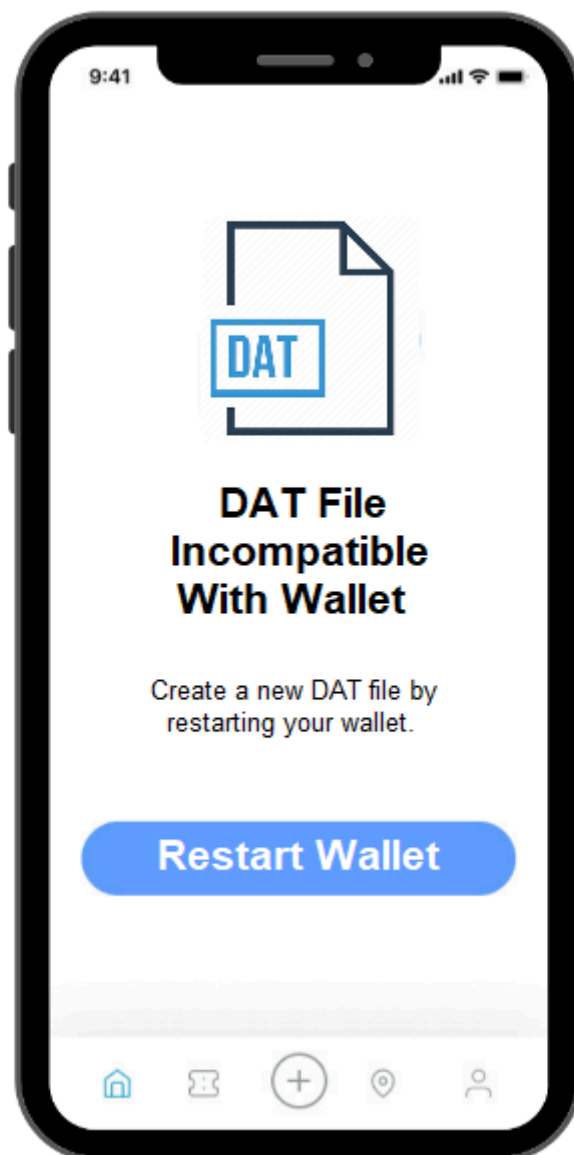
**Scenario:** A crypto trader is having trouble using their wallet's backup DAT file because it is no longer compatible with the wallet's updated directory files.

**Challenge:** Write a message for a desktop wallet app that the wallet's DAT file is no longer compatible with the wallet's newly updated directory files.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: DAT File Incompatible With Wallet

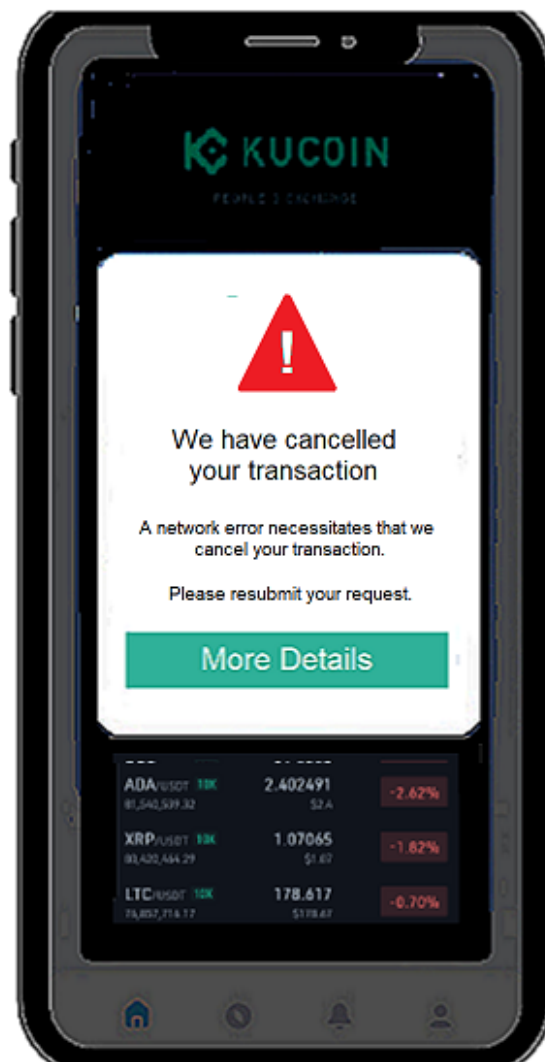
**Body:** 100 Characters max: Create a new DAT file by restarting your wallet

## Challenge 10: Transaction Canceled by Exchange

- Scenario:** A crypto trader's attempt to withdraw tokens from a centralized exchange has been stymied by a network error, instigating the exchange to cancel the transaction..
- Challenge:** Write a message for a centralized exchange revealing that a user's attempted transaction has been canceled..
- Headline:** 40 Characters max: We Have Canceled Your Transaction
- Body:** 100 Characters max: A network error necessitates we cancel your transaction. Please resubmit your request.
- Button:** 15 characters max: More Details



## Challenge 11: Transaction Warning to Select Correct Network

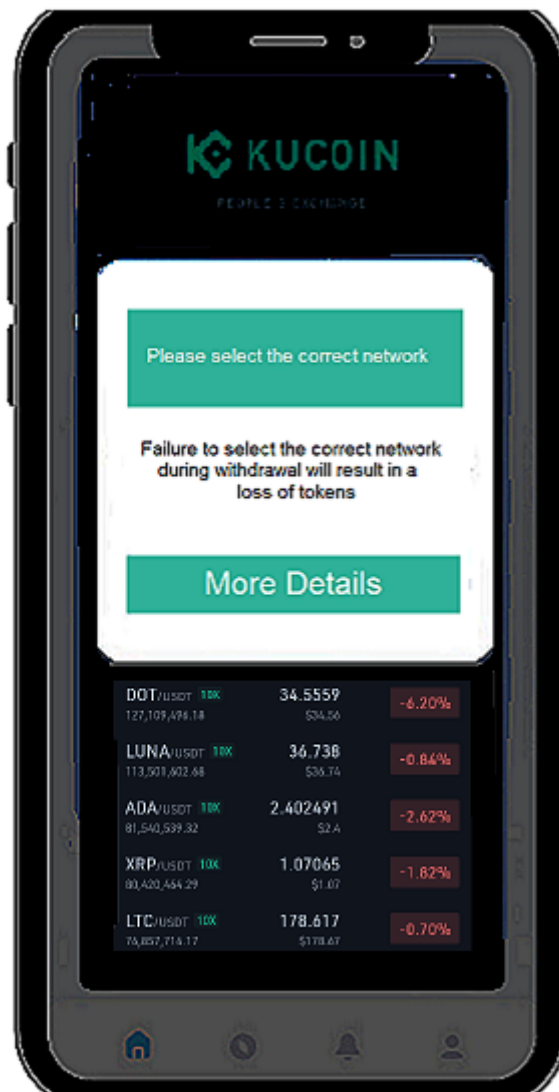
**Scenario:** A crypto trader is in the midst of filling in transaction details for an upcoming token withdrawal. Its imperative they select the correct network responsible for transferring the tokens, lest they lose all the tokens in the process.

**Challenge:** Write a message for a centralized exchange app warning users to carefully select the correct network before proceeding with a transaction.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: Please Select the Correct Network

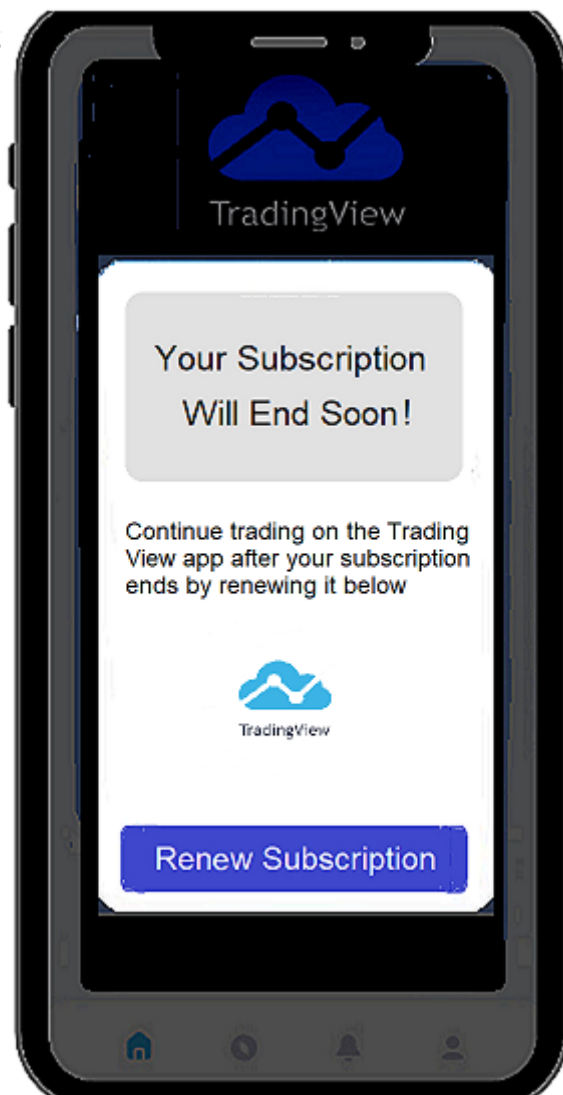
**Body:** 100 Characters max: Failure to select the correct network will result in a loss of tokens during withdrawal.

## Challenge 12: Subscription End for Crypto Trading App

- Scenario:** A crypto trader is nearing the end of their trading app's annual subscription run.
- Challenge:** Write a message for a crypto trading app warning users that their annual subscription is about to run out.
- Headline:** 40 Characters max: Your Subscription Will End Soon
- Body:** 100 Characters max: You can continue trading on our app after your subscription ends by renewing it below.
- Button:** 15 characters max: Renew Subscription



### Challenge 13: Swap Potential for Excessive Slippage

**Scenario:** A liquidity provider attempts to conduct trades on an automated market maker app absent a "confirm transaction prompt", thereby opening up the possibility of excessive slippage.

**Challenge:** Write a message from an automated market maker app warning users that they may experience excessive slippage with a transaction.

**Headline:** 40 Characters max: Token Swap Prone to Excessive Slippage

**Body:** 100 Characters max: Proceeding with this swap may result in lost funds.

**Button:** 15 characters max: More Details
